When people spend as much time and money as Chris has on their collection it's not easy to expose them to the potential dangers of play by others. Selection of Superflux and Cointaker LEDs

LEDs - A few years ago LEDs were a novelty pinball add-on; now they have moved into a volume product with some really good products out there. I was sent a set for my Spiderman by Andreas Gräber who runs www.superfluxshop.de as he wanted me to see how the good new non-flicker LEDs were.

Now here is the confession, I actually installed the LEDs at the end of last year when there was snow on the ground and people sang a Christmas carol or two. It was a cold and bleak house but once the LEDs were installed my Spiderman was truly vibrant. The, ahem, long term test has been really positive with absolutely no problems at all. If you are in Europe I can thoroughly recommend Andreas. His English is perfect so if you can't understand German just drop him a mail.

As you can see from the before and after pictures of my Spiderman the colors are simply vibrant and it looks fantastic. I'm sure if these LEDs were around in the old days the games would have used them and I think the games would have looked a lot different and much brighter.

For those based in the USA, which I guess will be the majority of PGJ readers, I can recommend Cointaker LEDs. They have a very wide range of LEDs including blindingly bright superbrite and a retro look, like a filament lamp, LED but does it collect black dust like the old ones?
